

Professor Dr. Ismail Hamed Ismail Ali, Dean of the College of Arts and Humanities at the Islamic University of Minnesota, undertook a scholarly trip to the Kingdom of Morocco during November 2024. The visit included a variety of academic activities.

The activities carried out by the dean included participating in the discussion of a doctoral thesis and delivering several lectures for doctoral and master's students at the College of Arts and Humanities at Mohammed V University in Rabat, as well as at other academic institutions in Morocco.

As part of these activities, Dr. Ismail Hamed delivered a lecture titled "The Moroccan Sahara: New Approaches" at the International Center for Heritage Studies and the Master's program in Arabic Literature and Cultural Exchange at Mohammed V University on Tuesday, November 2024 ,4. He also presented another lecture at the same center on November 2024 ,12, titled "Moroccan-Egyptian Spiritual Relations: Roots and Constants."

In addition, the dean was requested by Mohammed V University to evaluate a doctoral thesis entitled "Contemporary Islamic Thought and Community and Environmental Issues in the Mediterranean World."

Following his evaluation report, he was invited to participate as an expert in the thesis defense committee on November 2024,11.

Among the notable activities Dr. Ismail Hamed participated in was a roundtable discussion titled "The Moroccan Sahara: New Approaches," organized by the College of Arts and Humanities and the International Center for Saharan Studies in collaboration with the Master's programs in Arabic Literature and Cultural Exchange and Linguistics and Language Disorders. The roundtable featured prominent Moroccan academics, including Dr. Mohammed Adwan, former Vice President of Al-Qarawiyyin University, Dr. Mohammed Joudat, head of the Center for Saharan Studies, Dr. Mohammed Taqi, a linguistics professor at Mohammed V University, and Dr. Fatiha Belabbas, a professor at the same university. Some Moroccan newspapers reported on the proceedings of the roundtable with articles published on their websites. It is worth mentioning that this trip for the Dean of the College of Arts and Humanities at the Islamic University of Minnesota is part of his ongoing participation in various official invitations from prestigious Arab and international centers and universities, due to his prominence as a scholar in the field of African studies.

Meeting of Scientific Promotions Committee



The Scientific Promotions Committee at the College of Media at the Islamic University of Minnesota held its first meeting, chaired by Professor Abdulsalam Said Al-Wahati, with the presence of committee members: Dr. Hanan Sobhi Obaid (Vice Chair), Dr. Insaf Al-Moumani, Dr. Badia Ali Abdul Qader (Committee Secretary), and Dr. Yusra Mahmoud Subaih.

During the meeting, several important topics were discussed, including reviewing the new regulations and conditions for scientific promotions at the university, defining the roles of the Scientific Promotions Committee at the College of Media, and determining the committee's entitlements.

The meeting resulted in several recommendations, including the necessity for the majority of the members of the scientific promotions committees to hold the rank of Professor, with the option to include Associate Professors as long as they do not exceed %50 of the committee's composition. This allows them to examine, assess, and evaluate candidates for the ranks of Professor and Associate Professor. The committee was also emphasized to be an official body with the authority to issue decisions, while the university's higher

promotions committee acts as a court of cassation to review the compliance of college committee decisions with promotion conditions.

Additionally, the committee recommended that if the majority of the scientific promotions committee members in the colleges are not Associate Professors, it should be called the "Initial Review Committee for Promotion Applications." If the majority is even lower, it should be called the "Promotion Application Reception Committee," and it would not have the right to evaluate or issue decisions, with the university's higher promotions committee assuming all responsibilities.

The attendees also recommended distributing the entitlements of the scientific committees, derived from the fees due from the promoted individuals for their evaluation and assessment, among the accredited scientific promotions committee at the college, the university administration, and the higher promotions committee. The College of Media's Promotions Committee requested that the university administration publish a statement outlining the responsibilities of the accredited promotions committees in the colleges to enable them to perform their roles effectively.





Virtual Room Unit Transforms Course Schedule Organization

Engineer Mohammed Abdeljawad, Director of the Virtual Room and Recording Unit, reported that the unit utilized Google tools to prepare the course schedules. Initial schedules were sent to department heads via Google Sheets, with a dedicated sheet for each college, allowing only the department head to modify their subjects. Access was also granted to the college dean and administrative affairs in case of issues with the department head, using collaborative schedules that are automatically submitted to the unit without the need to upload and send files.

Abdeljawad added that schedules were prepared on Google Drive, and links were provided to department heads for review and approval, consolidating departments and stages into a single PDF file for easier review. After the schedules were approved, links for course materials on Zoom were set up, with a continuous link for each subject until the end of the first semester. The schedules were divided and sent to the secretaries for matching with the provided links.

He pointed out that the unit created automatic statistics to indicate available times in the rooms, which helped reduce inquiries about room availability. A collaborative file was also

created with secretaries for daily schedules, and a modification request survey was provided to department heads to simplify the submission of modification requests.

Regarding the playlists, Abdeljawad mentioned that 70 links were prepared for video playlists and 70 links for audio playlists, along with 546 Zoom links for each subject. Additionally, a Zoom room was approved for practical courses in the College of Computer Science and Information Technology, allowing lectures to be uploaded in various formats. The unit has also added new rooms that accommodate 300 students instead of 100, along with new departments, including the Department of Quranic Studies and its Sciences and the Department of Disasters and Crises. At the end of his remarks, Abdeljawad stated that the number of lectures reached 396 during the week, with the unit studying available

artificial intelligence tools on Zoom to enhance the educational process. The Virtual Room Unit is committed to continuous development to facilitate education within the university, contributing to an improved learning experience for students.



Conference and Seminar Unit Completes Scheduling Activities

Doctor Hanan Mukhtar, Director of the Conference and Seminar Unit at the Islamic University of Minnesota, announced that her administration has completed the scheduling of activities until the end of 2025, contributing to the university's widespread presence in academic and educational circles.

Dr. Hanan noted that this plan was implemented in response to the requests of various colleges that sought to include their conferences in the administration's schedule. 
Abu Bakr Hussein Earns **PhD in Jurisprudence**

Dean of College of Islamic Studies Emphasizes Importance of Raising Level of Academic Theses



Minnesota, November 2024, 12 - The Dean of the College of Islamic Studies at the Islamic University of Minnesota, Dr. Abdulrazeq Al-Bakri, emphasized the necessity of raising the level of academic theses during three consecutive meetings. He pointed out the importance of continuous supervision by faculty members over these theses, confirming that the administration has observations regarding the current quality of the theses.

In the meeting held on Friday, November 8, the dean dedicated time to discuss the college's preparation for the upcoming second semester. He urged department heads to fully deliver the curricula to faculty members and stressed the need to follow up with students to ensure they do not lose motivation.

The dean reviewed the importance of attendance, emphasizing that lectures should not be recorded for absent students except in extreme cases. He also assigned Dr. Ghada Al-Bahansi to oversee make-up lectures and report on them.



Meeting of Head of Department of Da'wah with Faculty Members

Doctor Taha Al-Jawhari, Head of the Department of Da'wah and Islamic Culture at the Islamic University of Minnesota, directed faculty members not to address politically-related topics or controversial issues that could lead to discussions consuming class time.

This guidance was given during a meeting held on Sunday, November 2024,17, to discuss preparations for the start of the second semester, including the submission of course plans and syllabi, discussions on assignments, exams, and necessary procedures for facilitating the educational process according to regulations and policies.

The meeting lasted for one hour, during which Dr. Al-Jawhari thanked the faculty members, the department secretary, and the administrative officer for their efforts in ensuring the success of the educational process in the previous semester. He encouraged them to commit to attendance and to conduct all scheduled classes (12 classes), emphasizing that absences should only occur in emergencies and that any missed class should be compensated as soon as possible.

Dr. Al-Jawhari also called for adherence to the prescribed curriculum, emphasizing it as the primary source. He urged faculty to prepare exam questions that are of an intermediate level, suitable for all students, and highlighted the importance of assignments that enrich students' knowledge. He urged thesis supervisors to follow up closely with their students and not to leave them without guidance.

At the end of the meeting, Dr. Al-Jawhari opened the floor for inquiries, responding to all questions raised by faculty members.

The meeting was attended by Dr. Ammar Al-Dale'in, Dr. Saad Tarahib Al-Hamadi, Dr. Al-Sayed Al-Bayoumi, Dr. Iyad Hamdan, Dr. Lutfi Koki, Ms. Anisa Al-Zekri (Administrative Officer of the College of Islamic Studies), and Ms. Zohoor Al-Zakri (College Secretary).

In the second meeting, the dean clarified that a daily report is submitted to the administration regarding the progress of the educational process. He reiterated the necessity of adhering to the curricula and refraining from discussing political or partisan topics in lectures, noting that the quality of academic theses reflects the seriousness of supervision.

Dr. Imad Al-Din Al-Ajili, Head of the Department of Creed and Contemporary Schools, addressed students in a meeting held on Tuesday, November 12, warning against absenteeism and stressing the importance of regular attendance. He also called for students to purify their intentions in seeking knowledge and to respect their lecturers.

These meetings are part of Dean Al-Bakri's plan to ensure the college is prepared for the second semester, reflecting the college's commitment to achieving high standards in education and academic research.



November 2024,16 – Dr. Manal Mustafa, Head of the Department of Islamic Studies in English, emphasized the department's commitment to fair criteria for selecting supervisors for academic theses during a meeting with faculty members. She highlighted the importance of allowing everyone to participate in supervision, stressing the need to consider criteria such as specialties and thesis topics to ensure equal opportunities for all faculty members.

The meeting, held on Saturday at 4 PM Mecca time, began with Dr. Manal welcoming the attendees, especially the new faculty members, and expressing gratitude for their ongoing support in achieving departmental excellence. She presented a series of important instructions for the second academic semester, including the need to adhere to attendance and lecture schedules and to facilitate courses through the use of presentation slides.

The department head explained that evaluations of faculty performance would be conducted and encouraged them to keep up with educational groups and participate in external activities such as scientific conferences and articles in the college journal. She also urged them to be attentive to students' well-being and inquire about the reasons for any absences, while emphasizing the importance of adhering to lecture times and delivering the instructional material in a concise and objective manner.

At the conclusion of the meeting, which lasted for one hour and forty minutes, faculty members were given the opportunity to ask questions, and Dr. Manal responded to all inquiries before thanking everyone for their attendance and participation.

Fatima Al-Wahsh Emphasizes Importance of Class Schedules

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Doctor Fatima Jumaa Al-Wahsh, Head of the Islamic Studies Department, held a meeting with faculty members of the department on Wednesday, November ,13 2024, at 10:00 PM Mecca time. The meeting focused on preparations for the upcoming second semester, during which Dr. Al-Wahsh welcomed the attendees, especially the new members.

She encouraged the use of modern methods in presenting material and the importance of responding to all student inquiries.

Regarding the grading system, Dr. Al-Wahsh explained that the grades would be

distributed as follows: 20 for the midterm exam, 20 for attendance, 20 for assignments, and 40 for the final exam. She noted that tracking attendance and absences is the responsibility of the department secretary and course assistants, not the faculty members.

Additionally, Dr. Al-Wahsh emphasized the need to alleviate the burden on students regarding assignments, suggesting that they should consist of post-lecture questions or research submissions due before February 2024 ,13. She also indicated that exams should be comprehensive and balanced to accommodate all students.

In closing, Dr. Al-Wahsh reiterated the importance of avoiding direct communication with students and insisted that all communication should go through the department head or the department secretary.

Meeting of Dean of Computer College and Information Technology



Doctor Muneer Abdulbari Abdulfattah, Dean of the College of Computers and Information Technology at the Islamic University of Minnesota, held a joint meeting with the college council and some faculty members, attended by the Vice Dean and administrative affairs, on Sunday, November 2024, 17, at 10:00 PM Mecca time.

The discussion also addressed supporting graduate students, particularly the challenges faced by students from various disciplines such as pharmacy and Islamic studies in adapting to the college's specializations. Solutions proposed included offering foundation courses to prepare new students and a high diploma program as a preliminary step before pursuing a master's degree.

Regarding schedule organization and curriculum, the dean directed the establishment of a clear plan to ensure that course materials align with student needs, calling for the adoption of suitable curricula and references to enhance the quality of education. Suggestions were made to regularly update educational resources, encourage collaboration between faculty and students through interactive workshops, and periodically review and evaluate the

Additionally, the College of Computers and Information Technology council held another meeting on Saturday, November 2024 ,16, at 10:00 PM to launch the second semester, which began on the same day. The meeting discussed the current situation in the college,

including the number of students and faculty members, and addressed issues that caused delays in preparing the semester schedules, emphasizing the need to assign schedule preparation to department heads without interference from administrative and technical units.

College of Educational Sciences Approves Launch of Scientific Peer-Reviewed Journal


Appointment of Dr. Yasser Al-Malek as Head of Computer Science Department
