

## College of Computing and Information Technology Achievements – August 2025

The College of Computing and Information Technology continued its efforts during August 2025 to achieve academic and administrative excellence, implementing a range of vital tasks and recording significant achievements that contribute to developing the educational environment and serving students and faculty members.

### -First: Academic Achievements

**Successful Completion of Midterm Exams:** Midterm exams were completed smoothly according to academic standards, with quality control of questions and clarity of instructions for all students.

**-College Council Meeting to Review Academic Performance** The College Council met on August 18 to review academic performance and evaluate midterm results. The meeting concluded with several important points, most notably:

**-Emphasizing the early start of preparing study schedules for the next semester in coordination between departments.**

**Activating academic guidance for** -.-Monitoring academic content and ensuring uniformity across divisions new and low-performing students

**.-Reviewing the test preparation mechanism and ensuring its alignment with learning outcomes**

**-University textbook preparation is underway:** The college, in coordination with the university's University Textbook Committee, has begun preparing academic textbooks for the courses. The following points apply:

The first completed textbook has been submitted to the committee for review and approval

**-Additional textbooks are being prepared for a number of other courses, as part of an integrated plan to provide standardized and approved study materials**

### Second: Administrative and Organizational Achievements

**-Monitoring the regularity of lectures and assignments:** The Administrative Affairs Unit monitored the progress of lectures on a daily basis, coordinating to make up for postponed lectures and ensuring that educational content is updated by the secretaries

**-Monitoring costs and exams:** Faculty members monitored cost increases, and coordination with the relevant committees ensured readiness and transparency in assessment

**-Advance planning for the next semester:** The Schedules Committee, in coordination with the academic departments, began preparing the academic schedules for the next semester, taking

into account the equitable distribution of courses and specific specialization

-Supporting self-learning: The process of adding new students to the self-learning system has been completed, and subject-specific groups have been created and distributed to faculty members.

-Documentation and Administrative Follow-up;

-Documenting official minutes and letters and uploading them to electronic platforms

-Responding to faculty and student inquiries

-Posting administrative and educational updates as they occur
