Conclusion of International Scientific Conference



































The International Scientific Conference "Jurisprudential, Legal, and Educational Developments for Muslims in the West" successfully concluded its proceedings in Houston, Texas, USA. After two days of intensive scientific sessions, the conference yielded constructive recommendations aimed at fostering the integration of Muslims into Western societies while preserving their religious and cultural identity. The conference activities spanned nine hours, divided into four sessions.

The conference commenced on Friday, August 2025, 29, organized jointly by the Islamic University of Minnesota – Main Center, and Al-Ahliyya Amman University in Jordan. The event witnessed the participation of a distinguished group of researchers and scholars from several Arab and foreign countries, including Jordan, Syria, Algeria, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Libya, Turkey, and the United States of America.

The honorary presidency of the conference was held by Professor Dr. Walid bin Idris Al-Meneesi, President of the Islamic University of Minnesota, and Professor Dr. Haitham Abu Khadija, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Al-Ahliyya Amman University in Jordan. The conference was also chaired by Professor Dr. Omar Al-Maqrami, Vice President of the Islamic University of Minnesota – Main Center, and Professor Dr. Alaa Al-Qudah, General Manager of AMERICAN KNOWLEDGE ACADEMY.

Professor Dr. Emad Ali Al-Khatib, Director of the Conferences and Seminars Management Unit at the Islamic University of Minnesota – Main Center, headed the supreme organizing committees of the conference. Dr. Zainab Bassiouni, Vice President of the Islamic University of Minnesota – Main Center, oversaw the general administration of the conference, with Dr. Hanan Obaid from the same university serving as her deputy. The general secretariat of the conference was undertaken by Professor Dr. Maher Aref, former Director of the Jordanian Scholars Association.

The four sessions of the conference covered diverse and interconnected themes. The first session addressed "Jurisprudential Developments - Between Law and Customs," and the second session focused on "Jurisprudential Developments - Between Education and Ethics." On the second day, the first session was dedicated to discussing "Jurisprudential Developments - Between the

Constant and the Changing," while the second session concentrated on "Jurisprudential Developments - in the Age of Artificial Intelligence.

"Dr. Ali El-Shboul, Director of the Latin American Studies Center and Director of the Language Center at the Islamic University of Minnesota, moderated the conference. The opening ceremony featured significant speeches, including a speech by Dr. Zainab Bassiouni on behalf of the University President, a speech by His Excellency Professor Dr. Abdul Nasser Abu Al-Basal, former Minister of Awqaf, Islamic Affairs and Holy Sites and President of the Jordanian Scholars Association, and a speech by Professor Dr. Abdulsalam Al-Fandi representing Al-Ahliyya Amman University in Jordan. Dr. Alaa Al-Qudah emphasized the conference's importance in highlighting the rapid changes faced by Muslims in the West and providing practical solutions to enhance their integration while preserving their identity.

The sessions included presentations of valuable research. In the first session, chaired by Dr. Omar Shuqairat, Professor Dr. Muzahim Tariq Al-Mustafa presented a paper titled "The Role of Endowments in Social and Economic Development," Dr. Ali Ibrahim El-Shboul presented a paper on "Islam in Spain: Past and Present," and Dr. Firas Ali Al-Shiab concluded the session with a paper on "Loyalty and Disavowal in Islam: A Moderate Study.

"In the second session, chaired by Professor Dr. Emad Ali Al-Khatib, Professor Dr. Abdulqader Miloud Salameh and Dr. Amina Ahmed Al-Hashemi presented a joint paper titled "Islamic Culture and Mechanisms for its Preservation in a Multi-Identity Environment," Dr. Majed Nasser Al-Mahrouqi presented a paper on "The Impact of Arab Educational Policies on Shaping the Identity of the Emerging Muslim Generation," Dr. Ayada Ashour Harhour presented a paper on "Mosques and Their Role in Promoting Political Participation of Muslims in the United States," and Dr. Ayman Al-Halhaleh presented a paper titled "Legal Challenges Facing Muslims in the West: Towards a Legal Framework for Protecting Religious Identity.

"The sessions continued on the second day, with Professor Dr. Abdulsalam Al-Fandi chairing the first session, which discussed research including Dr. Hamza Mustafa Yaqoub's paper titled "Sharia Arbitration for Muslim Minorities in the

West: Challenges and Solutions – Application to Canadian Law in Commercial and Family Cases," Professor Dr. Emad Ali Al-Khatib's paper on "Rulings on the Sale of Slaves in Jurisprudential Discourse," Dr. Mai Khalid Baklizi's paper on "The Evolution of the Term Zakat Between Ancient and Modern: A Linguistic and Jurisprudential Study," and Dr. Noah MohammEd Al-Fadoul's paper on "Rulings on Sale in Dealing with Non-Muslims – A Maqasid Study of the Sale of Alcohol and Pork as a Model.

"Professor Dr. Alaa Al-Qudah chaired the second session of the second day, which included a discussion of Dr. Sahar Talaat Al-Samadi and Ms. Ahlam Al-Samadi's paper titled "Human Communication with Smart Converters in the Balance of Islamic Sharia," Mr. Mustafa Nasser Al-Naabi's paper on "Mechanisms for Investing Endowment Funds," Dr. Abdullah Abu Musameh's paper on "Islamic Economic Media in the Age of Artificial Intelligence for Depicting Media Strategies Supporting Financial Inclusion and Economic Integration of Muslims in the West," and Professor Dr. Mansour Ali Al-Qudah's paper titled "The Reliability of the (Kuzu) Methodology in Sharia Auditing.

"The conference sessions concluded with the formation of a recommendations committee comprising participating professors and researchers. Dr. Zainab Basyouni then recited the most important recommendations that emerged from the discussions. These recommendations included highlighting the reality of Muslims in the West and linking conference topics to their daily issues, encouraging the study of Sharia objectives and comparing them with contemporary changes, integrating artificial intelligence technologies such as ChatGPT into the service of Islamic issues, developing specialized software for the Islamic world subject to scientific and technical oversight, and enhancing cooperation between mosques and Islamic centers in the West and charitable institutions in Islamic countries, among other important recommendations.

Finally, the supreme administration of the conference, represented by Dr. Ali El-Shboul, extended its gratitude to the heads of the conference committees from the participating universities and to all committee members who contributed to the success of this prominent scientific event.

Important Warning Regarding YouTube Publishing Policy

Engineer Mohammed Abduljawad, the Director of the Educational Rooms and Registrations Unit at the Islamic University of Minnesota, has alerted all faculty members about the necessity of adhering to the publishing policy set by YouTube. This is crucial for maintaining the integrity of the university's channel dedicated to academic lectures.

Engineer Abduljawad emphasized that YouTube sends notifications regarding certain video recordings of lectures that violate publishing policies. He referenced examples of warning messages that have been received. He urged faculty members to be aware of the publishing policy terms to avoid the risk of having lecture videos blocked or facing actions that could jeopardize the channel, based on the warnings received.

Abduljawad warned that the university's YouTube channel for lectures is currently under close scrutiny due to some violations of the site's policies. He confirmed that the Educational Rooms Unit will educate faculty members about YouTube's publishing policy and ensure they understand how to effectively use Zoom rooms for educational purposes.

Academic Visit of Dr. Ismail Hamed

The visit included the Oman National Archives and university libraries, as part of Dr. Ismail's mission to study ancient Islamic manuscripts and documents. This visit is part of his scientific project, in which he has invested many years of historical

It is worth mentioning that Dr. Ismail Hamed has extensive scholarly activity and distinguished research, having published dozens of books, papers, and peer-reviewed studies in various fields, especially in the history of Islamic civilization and the history of Islam in sub-Saharan Africa. He is also interested in the ancient history of Oman and its relations with the East African coastal countries, as well as the Omani role in establishing many Arab kingdoms and sultanates along the East African coast, such as the Sultanate of Zanzibar. Dr. Ismail is considered one of the leading scholars in these fields.





Deputy Dean: Student Evaluation System Through Online Portal is Excellent



Doctor Zainab Ali Basyouni, the Deputy Dean of the Islamic University of Minnesota, expressed her satisfaction with the current system for evaluating students via the online portal, describing it as "very excellent" and achieving several key goals, including accommodating student levels, standardizing procedures, and ensuring fairness and transparency in grading. She added that it helps reduce the burden on faculty members, allowing them to fully engage in their academic role in preparing and grading exams electronically if they are objective, while the professor handles grading essay exams.

Dr. Zainab's remarks came after an open discussion held by the main group of the university community on WhatsApp, where opinions were exchanged about the techniques and methods used in student evaluation. Opinions varied between supporters of the evaluation system and critics of aspects they see as lacking, focusing on evaluation techniques that rely on automated methods for objective tests, in addition to the manual grading method for essay exams.

The Deputy Dean expressed her happiness with the discussion, describing it as wonderful, and thanked the faculty members for their valuable feedback and suggestions that reflect their commitment to improving the educational process. She emphasized that any new system requires a period for adjustment and practice, noting that the cooperation and experience of faculty members will make the evaluation system smoother and more effective.

Several academics participated in the discussion, including Dr. Yousef Bani Younis, Dean of the College of Developmental Studies, Dr. Nourhan Salama, Dean of Faculty Affairs, and several faculty members from various departments, reflecting the university's interest in promoting academic dialogue and developing educational performance.

The university continues to prioritize ongoing development and modernization aimed at serving students and enhancing the quality of education to match its esteemed status.

College of Computing Holds Regular Council Meeting

The College of Computing and Information Technology at the Islamic University of Minnesota – Main Center, held its regular council meeting on Monday evening, August 2025, 18, under the chairmanship of the Dean, Assoc, Prof. Dr. Muneer Abdulbari, with the participation of the college's vice-deans, department chairs, and a number of administrative officials.

The Dean opened the session by welcoming the attendees and stressing that the main objective of the meeting was to evaluate the educational process at mid-semester, review overall academic performance, and discuss course quality, examination mechanisms, and academic advising, in order to enhance educational outcomes and achieve academic excellence.

The council discussed several key topics, including adherence to the academic plan and ensuring clarity of course content, challenges faced by first-year students in practical courses and English, exam preparation in alignment with learning outcomes, activation of academic advising to follow up with new students and support low-performing ones, coordination among departments to unify course content before the start of the semester, prompt handling of administrative remarks and complaints, and monitoring faculty attendance and punctuality to maintain the continuity of the teaching process.

- The meeting concluded with a set of recommendations, most notably:
- Unifying course content before the beginning of the semester.
- Adopting unified exam guidelines in coordination with the control office.
- Systematically activating academic advising.
- Starting early in preparing the schedule for the second semester.
- Speeding up the disbursement of faculty financial entitlements.

Requiring the student affairs office to handle students' issues through department chairs first, ensuring a balanced and dialogue-based educational environment.

The council ended its session at 11:00 p.m. in a positive atmosphere that reflected the commitment of all parties to enhancing the quality of education and strengthening the college's academic standing.

In addition to the Dean, the meeting was attended by the College Vice-Dean, Dr. Salah Alawi (Chair of the Department of Networks and Cybersecurity), Dr. Saleh Al-Riyashi (Chair of the Information Systems Department), Dr. Bushra Abrar (Chair of the Data Science and Artificial Intelligence Department), Dr. Mohammed Rashidi (Deputy Chair of the Information Systems Department), and Ms. Hanadi Abdullah (Administrative Affairs Officer).







College of Economics Holds Meetings to Discuss Midterm Exams

The College of Economics and Business at the Islamic University of Minnesota held its fifth meeting, chaired by Dean Dr. Sherin Mamoun, on the evening of Thursday, August 2025 ,7. The meeting was attended by the college council and faculty members. This gathering was part of the final preparations for the midterm exams for the first semester of the 2026/2025 academic year. The dean opened the meeting with a welcoming speech, expressing her gratitude to those present. Instructions regarding the exams were discussed. The exam period was set to begin on Saturday, August 2025, 9, and continue until Thursday, August 2025, 14, with each exam lasting two hours, from 8:00 PM to 10:00 PM Mecca time. Faculty members were also reminded of the importance of being available in their respective subject groups to respond to student inquiries and explain the grading distribution process.

During the meeting, department heads and their deputies were given the opportunity to express their readiness to conduct the exams, and faculty members' comments and suggestions were heard. At the end of the meeting, the dean reiterated her appreciation to all attendees for their cooperation and efforts in ensuring the success of the educational process.

Later, on the evening of Monday, August 2025,11, the college held its sixth meeting, again chaired by Dean Dr. Sherin Mamoun, to discuss the opening of two new departments: the Department of Finance and Investment, and the Department of Project Management.

The dean began the meeting with a welcoming address, thanking attendees for their interest and cooperation. The agenda was reviewed, which included presenting the vision, mission, and objectives of the new departments, as well as discussing the academic plans for undergraduate, master's, and doctoral programs.

Academic Debate on Exams and Assessment Mechanisms

The main faculty group at the Islamic University of Minnesota - Main Center - on WhatsApp has recently witnessed a vibrant intellectual exchange, where professors used the platform to raise fundamental issues at the heart of the educational process. A recent discussion quickly evolved from an individual comment into a collective brainstorming session, reflecting the university's flexibility and its administration's commitment to quality and leadership in online education.

Authority to Adjust Grades

The debate began with a proposal from Dr. Yousef Bani Younes, Dean of the College of Developmental Studies, who suggested granting course instructors the authority to adjust exam grades just as they do with assignments. Supporting him, Dr. Abdulaziz Al-Zahrani argued that some students deserve grade adjustments in recognition of their effort despite struggling in exams.

However, Dr. Ali Ouda rejected the idea, warning that it could create an additional burden, emphasizing instead that exam questions should accommodate varying student levels. Meanwhile, Dr. Sahar Al-Samadi argued that adjusting assignments does not fully capture student effort, calling instead for marks to be allocated for participation.

Criticism of Current Exam System

Supporters of the Current System

On the other hand, Dr. Mona Al-Loboudi defended the existing system, calling it "well-designed" and ensuring guick results without injustice. Dr. Hafez La far, however, warned against the spread of cheating. Responding to him, Dr. Shaimaa Khattab stressed that a professor's responsibility ends with evaluating submitted work, and that student commitment to study is itself a value worthy of respect-a point supported by Dr. Afaf Al-Haddad.

Challenge of Artificial Intelligence

Dr. Salah Farraj acknowledged that some students' use of Al tools has become a tangible reality. Dr. Afaf Al-Haddad proposed adopting the "open book" model to address this issue, while Dr. Mohammed Abbas suggested practical projects or direct interviews, though he admitted such measures may be difficult to implement with large numbers of students.

University's Official Position

Amid the debate, Dr. Nourhan Salama, Dean of Faculty Affairs, clarified that the newly adopted electronic system remains the official reference, stressing that any grade adjustment must be processed by the course instructor before being submitted to the control office. Supporting her, Dr. Ibrahim Al-Ajlouni described the current exam system as Dr. Yasser Al-Malek, Head of the Computer Science

artificial intelligence, suggesting a reduction in the time given Dr. Dhuqan Ubaidat suggested awarding grades for attendance and participation to avoid disputes over exam adjustments.

Dr. Majid bin Obeid raised critical questions about fairness between diligent students and those who rely on technological shortcuts, warning of the future credibility of online education

Dr. Marwan Al-Abbas stressed the importance of designing practical, real-world-based exam questions and recommended plagiarism detection tools such as Turnitin. Dr. Mousa Mohamed Nour Al-Daw called for more diverse assessment methods, including short guizzes, oral discussions, and presentations.

Toward Broader Academic Symposium

The debate concluded with a proposal from Dr. Ibrahim Al-Ajlouni to hold an expanded academic symposium with experts, aimed at producing practical recommendations. The idea was widely welcomed by faculty members, reflecting a shared awareness of the need for continuous development to meet the challenges of online education.

Response from University Leadership

At the end of the discussion, the administration's official position was conveyed by Vice Provost Dr. Zainab Basyouni, who affirmed the university's commitment to listening to all viewpoints and considering them as a foundation for academic development. She stressed that this inclusive approach would enhance the university's standing and leadership in the field of distance education.

On Wednesday, August 2025, 13, the Research Unit at the Islamic University of Minnesota held an expanded meeting with the editorial board of the College of Education Journal, attended by prominent academic leaders.

The meeting was chaired by Dr. Abdullah Abdulnabi. Dean of the College of Education and Head of the Editorial Board, along with the participation of Dr. Heba Tawfiq Abu Ayada, Deputy Head of the Editorial Board; Dr. Anas Odaibat, Editorial Secretary; Dr. Nourhan Salama, Dean of Faculty Affairs; and Dr. Shaimaa Khattab, Director of the Research Unit and International Cooperation.

The session discussed a series of quality proposals, including allocating space in the journal to showcase the latest research publications and scientific books by faculty members, as well as highlighting the academic theses awarded within the college. It was also proposed to create a comprehensive database of publications, appointing a coordinator in each department to ensure continuity, and opening up publishing opportunities for foreign research by doctoral students.

Additionally, the idea of preparing bilingual profiles and summaries for research papers was discussed, along with uploading them to the digital library. The journal's division into specialized sections and issuing special editions to discuss current issues were also considered. The possibility of transforming the journal into a semi-annual publication was discussed to allow sufficient time for review and editing.

In a related context, the joint meeting between the digital library and the technology unit resulted in important decisions, including re-categorizing digital files, issuing annual subscription cards at nominal fees for students, and creating a guiding database to support research skills.

A proposal was also put forward to produce audio summaries of scientific research using artificial intelligence and make them available through the digital library, along with coordination with the Languages and Translation Center to conduct specialized English language courses for students in the College of Computing and Information.
