Third Issue of the International Journal of Academic Studies, "Minnesota," is Released.



The third issue (September edition) of the International Journal of Academic Studies, Minnesota, has been released, as announced by the Media Center at the main center of the Islamic University of Minnesota.

The issue, distributed by the Media Center, consists of 171 pages and includes nine peer-reviewed scientific research papers published in both Arabic and English. These papers cover various fields and are authored by researchers from multiple countries.

In a statement to the university's official news website, Professor Hanan Sobhi Obaid, the editor-in-chief of the journal, mentioned that the nine papers went through initial editorial review by the editorial board before being sent to two specialized reviewers for thorough evaluation.

Professor Obaid added that the reviewers were honored with a "Certification of Appreciation" that included their names, the papers they reviewed, and the dates of review, which brought joy to their hearts due to the recognition of their efforts.

She continued by highlighting that the papers addressed developments in several areas, such as the necessity and developmental option of e-learning, as well as topics related to jurisprudence, philosophy, strategic planning, politics, media, economics, sociology, and law. These papers are connected to the current variables within these fields.

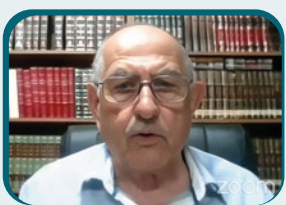
According to Professor Obaid, the third issue stood out for the quality of its research papers and the geographic diversity of the researchers from different countries, including the United Kingdom, Iraq, Sudan, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Egypt, and Palestine. She also praised the quality of the planning process, which lasted for three months from July to September 2023.

The editor-in-chief also acknowledged the coordination and cooperation of the editorial team,

including the General Supervisor, Chairman of the Board of Directors, Editor-in-Chief, Deputy Chairman of the Board of Directors, Managing Editor, Deputy Managing Editor, and Editorial Secretary, along with the support of the Media Center at the university. She emphasized that everyone worked as a team, akin to a beehive, to successfully publish the issue according to the strategic plan. She expressed the editorial team's aspirations to elevate the journal's score by obtaining an ISSN and DOI, aiming for classification in Clarivate and subsequently achieving global recognition in Scopus.

Regarding the researchers' nationalities, it is worth mentioning that Iraq had four researchers, followed by Egypt, Jordan, and Sudan with one researcher each. Palestine, Saudi Arabia, and the United Kingdom also had one researcher each.

It should be noted that the International Journal of Academic Studies, Minnesota, is overseen by Professor Walid Al-Menisi, the President of the Islamic University of Minnesota (all branches). The rest of the editorial team belongs to the main center, which adopts the journal. The editorial team is led by Dr. Omar Al-Maqrami, the Deputy President of the University and Head of the Main Center. The journal's board of directors is headed by Professor Abdulkarim Al-Wazzan, the Dean of the College of Media at the main center. Professor Hanan Sobhi Obaid, the Head of the Graduate Studies Department at the College of Media, manages the editorial work. Dr. Mohammed Ali Ismail, the Director of the Scientific Research Unit, serves as the Deputy Managing Editor, while Dr. Abdo Nasr Al-Silani handles the editorial secretary position. The journal has an advisory board consisting of nearly forty professors and doctors. It is published both in print and electronically, with the professional graphic design done by Abdullah Darras, a Jordanian graphic designer.

Islamic Studies College Launches "Journal of Islamic Studies" and Establishes a Special Committee for Project Development and Proposals.



Dr. Abdulrazzaq Al-Bakri, the Dean of the College of Islamic Studies at the Islamic University of Minnesota - Main Center, announced that the college has held a series of necessary meetings to ensure the smooth and effective functioning of the educational process in the college's various departments.

Al-Bakri mentioned that within this framework, three meetings were held under his chairmanship: the first meeting brought together department heads and their deputies, the second meeting included faculty members of the college, and the third meeting was held with the students of the College of Islamic Studies. In addition to these college-specific meetings, according to Al-Bakri, there were sub-meetings held at the department level, attended by department heads and their deputies, along with faculty members of the departments.

Al-Bakri emphasized that the college's dean's office closely monitors the educational process, including the distribution of courses to department professors according to the plan and the working mechanism. They also pay attention to any modifications that occur in each semester and call for minimizing any disruptions. When it comes to submitting course syllabi, they emphasize selecting the appropriate date and timing for each professor and submitting requests for the need of professors in certain departments through communication with the Faculty Affairs Administration. They also monitor the midterm exams, with Al-Bakri noting the priority given by the College of Islamic Studies to the timely delivery and grading of exams for students on the portal.

Regarding the college's preparations for the second semester, Al-Bakri mentioned that the college collaborated with the Audiovisual Unit in preparing the schedules for the second semester of the academic year 1445/1446 on Google Drive. This was done with the assistance of the Administrative Affairs Unit of the College of Islamic Studies, which saved and archived the college's internal files on the website.

Regarding the final exams of the first semester, Al-Bakri stated that the final exam files for the academic year 1444/1445 were delivered and shared with the control unit via Google Drive.

Al-Bakri highlighted the college's new achievement, which is the issuance of a license for the college's peer-reviewed journal under the name "Journal of the College of Islamic Studies." He stated that they have started receiving research papers from faculty members and submitting them to reviewers.

Al-Bakri concluded his statements by announcing the establishment of a specialized WhatsApp group comprising members of a committee dedicated to the development and proposal of meaningful projects in the Department of Islamic Studies in the English language.



Presented by Dr. Shaboul, the Language Center Launches Spanish Language Course

The Language and Translation Center, affiliated with the Islamic University of Minnesota - Main Center, inaugurated its activities by introducing a beginner's course in the Spanish language. The event witnessed the participation of officials from the university and a significant number of participants from around the world. This course marks the beginning of a series of language courses planned by the center, reflecting its future action plan.

The course, titled "Spanish Language from Zero to Mastery," was inaugurated on Tuesday, October 17th, under the supervision of Dr. Ismail Hamed, the Dean of the College of Arts, and Dr. Mohammed Tawfiq, the Deputy Director of the Center. Dr. Zainab Ali Basyouni, the Center's Secretary, oversaw the course proceedings alongside Mr. Taher Mohammed Alwan, the Center's secretary.

The course duration is 16 certified hours, and it attracted more than 100 participants, including researchers from outside the university. Dr. Basyouni expressed her satisfaction with the remarkable response and highlighted the course's specific title, "Spanish Language from Zero to Mastery."

Dr. Ali Al-Shaboul, a distinguished linguist with a Ph.D. in Comparative Linguistics - Spanish and Arabic from the Autonomous University of Madrid, Spain (1993), and an advanced diploma from the same university (1998), was selected as the presenter for this course. Dr. Basyouni commended the center's choice of Dr. Al-Shaboul for his expertise in delivering the course.

Dr. Basyouni revealed that the Language and Translation Center is preparing to offer a preliminary course in the English language, as well as TOEFL and IELTS courses. These courses will be taught by highly skilled English language experts from the College of Arts and Humanities. The center aims to provide an excellent learning experience and help participants achieve the highest level of proficiency.

Moreover, Dr. Basyouni emphasized the center's plan to teach Arabic language skills to non-native speakers, covering reading, writing, and speaking, along with specialized Arabic language courses. The center is also in the process of organizing courses in other distinguished languages such as Assyrian Aramaic, Persian, and French, in line with its motto of taking learners "From Zero to Mastery."

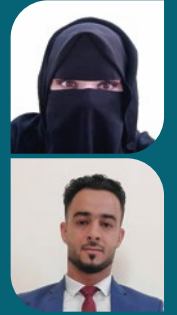
